## **Funding Source**

- The KC Animal Health Corridor Market Insight Seminar is a newly established event designated as a primary funding source for this initiative. The event will occur prior to the Homecoming dinner and will be presented by the KCAHC in partnership with Animalytix; UBM Americas, Veterinary; Vet-Advantage Magazine and the Fountain Report. The cost of the program is \$95 per attendee and all proceeds will be donated to the selected recipient less any applicable credit card processing fees.
- Additional donations will be accepted from individuals or companies who would like to contribute.

## Selection Process

- Animalytix; UBM Americas, Veterinary; Vet-Advantage Magazine and the Fountain Report will work in coordination with the Chair of the KCAHC to make a recommendation to the full KCAHC Board.
- The recommendation will be provided by **March 1** each year.
- The KCAHC Board will review and discuss the recommendation at the first board meeting of the year.
- KCAHC staff will notify the organization selected to receive the donation and make arrangements with them to attend the Homecoming Dinner to accept the donation.
